2021 was another year of challenge and change. The amazing staff at DIW continued to work creatively and diligently to deliver services to our community in the face of COVID-19. We are grateful to the Native American Community Clinic and Indian Health Board for prioritizing our staff for vaccinations when they became available. Some of our staff, such as those in the food shelf and at our Healing Spirit home, never had the luxury of working from home. Most of our staff were able to work a hybrid model, gradually increasing the size and frequency of in person meetings. We all do better when we are together in community, and our goal in 2021 was to be in-person as much as we safely could do so.

Many of our 2021 highlights are detailed in the report that follows. Another highlight that exemplifies our passion for serving our people was an award we received as part of the American Indian Food Security Work Group. We were selected as a 2021 Commissioner's Circle of Excellence Award winner by the Minnesota Department of Human Services. In the words of DHS "The awards recognize excellence among human services providers, counties, tribes, advocacy groups and other organizations that work in partnership with DHS to help people meet their basic needs so they can live in dignity and achieve their highest potential."

# 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

### Vikings Table Partnership




During 2021, we partnered with Vikings Table to deliver 100 meals each week to elders and other homebound community members. We were featured in the Minnesota Vikings Foundation Impact Report as their Spotlight Nonprofit Partner.

We also received technology funds through the Vikings Foundation which was invested in our Youth Leadership Council. These funds allowed for meetings to happen via Zoom, Fitbits for youth to encourage overall health, computers and printers for college students, and more.

# Horizons Unlimited Food Shelf Holiday Baskets

DIW's Horizons Unlimited (HU) Food Shelf distributed baskets in April, October, November, and December to elders and families in our community. During the Spring Feast Giveaway HU served 278 families. In November, 350 holiday baskets with turkey and sides were distributed and in December, 295 holiday baskets were distributed. A special meat giveaway was held in October for Indigenous People's Day.





HU Food Shelf also provided food boxes, meat, and other items to Minneapolis American Indian Center (MAIC) and Bii Dii Gain, an Elders Apartment Complex.

MAIC had to suspend their elder meal delivery due to Covid, but they wanted to provide food in another way. Bii Dii Gain came through weekly to pick up baked goods and sometimes other perishable goods.




